MEMBERSHIP 101

The Clock Is Ticking—In just four more weeks, on July 1, Sequoia Village will open its virtual doors by welcoming its members to a community village built by a group of public-spirited volunteers who believe in "neighbors helping neighbors".

Sequoia Village, will keep its members connected by providing resources where you will feel safe and comfortable in your own home as you age.

How will our members connect? Our vetted Volunteers will make themselves available when they:



- Come to your home to perform simple handyman tasks and other assisted services, along with friendly calls and home visits
- Provide free transportation by trained drivers
- Provide a resource directory listing highly skilled, screened and discounted services (when our volunteers are unable to fulfill your requests)
- Enjoy member's social gatherings. (You'll not want to miss our 1st Annual Members Dinner Dance on Saturday, Aug 29th).

How to get on board now and save money? Before July 1 you can take part in our *EARLY BIRD SPECIAL*. The cost for the first year is \$300 for a Single membership, \$425 for a Household membership, when paid in full a year in advance.

After July 1 the membership fees are:

Single: When paid by monthly installments, the cost is \$55/month or \$660/year. *When paid a full year in advance, the cost is \$600/year.*

Household: (2 or more residing in the home) When paid by monthly installment, the cost is \$70/month or \$840/year. When paid a full year in advance, the cost is \$750/year.

Associate Membership: The cost is \$300/year for a single membership. The cost is \$425/year for a household membership. (\$250 and \$375 is a tax deductible donation to Sequoia Village)
